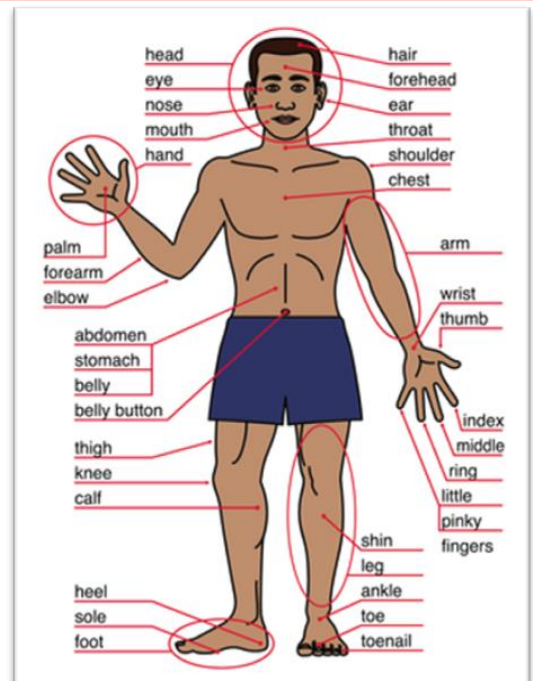

Key Vocabulary and Spellings

1	Invertebrates	An animal with no backbone.
2	Fish	An animal with fins and gills that lives in water.
3	Amphibians	An animal that lives on land and in water.
4	Reptiles	An animal that has cold blood, scaly skin and lays eggs on land.
5	Birds	An animal with feathers, wings and a beak that is usually is able to fly.
6	Mammals	An animal that feeds its young with milk and usually has skin with some hair.
7	Carnivore	An animal that eats meat as its primary source of food.
8	Herbivore	An animal that eats plants as its primary source of food.
9	Omnivore	An animal that eats both plants and meat.
10	Wild	An animal that is not tame or friendly.
